Vigilance arrests shopkeeper selling Liquor at exorbitant rates

Chandigarh, April 7: Punjab Vigilance Bureau today arrested a shopkeeper who was found to be selling Liquor at exorbitant rates to the public in Dhakoli district SAS Nagar.

Disclosing this, a spokesperson of the Vigilance Bureau said Chief Director Vigilance Bureau BK Uppal has already directed all the officers to keep a strict vigil on the shops and suppliers in the state to check the prices and hoardings of essential goods during the curfew which was imposed to contain the spread the disease of COVID-19.

On the basis of complaints received, a VB flying squad team led by AIG Ashish Kapoor raided the Liquor Shop in Panchkula Modern Complex, Dhakoli and found that Liquor were being sold at much higher rates than normal rates through the small window in his Tavern. The vigilance team immediately arrested the owner of the Liquor shop Parveen Kumar. In this regard, a FIR number 80 has been registered against him under section 188 of IPC at police station Dhakoli, SAS Nagar.
